Managing risks in progressive MS

- *describe the risks which can be associated with facilitating independence in people with severe MS*
- *discuss the issues raised by pwMS when making a decision about their care which the HCP may disagree with*
- *understand how to reconcile risk with the well-being of the pwMS*

Ethics and palliative care

- *gain an understanding of the legal framework for decision making at the end of life*
- *explore the key ethical issues in palliative care*

Effective and efficient DMD Monitoring

- *describe the components of an effective DMD monitoring service*
- *discuss the challenges in running an effective monitoring service*
- *identify tips they can implement within their service to make that more effective and efficient*

Understanding MS and mental health

- *understand the aetiology, assessment and treatment of depression and anxiety in people with MS*
- *gain knowledge of mental health disorders that can occur secondary to MS and understand and assess the risk of suicide*
- *distinguish mental health problems from difficulties with cognition and social cognition and recognise how all these problems impact on families*
- *identify ways to support people with MS and learn how to contribute to the prevention of mental health symptoms*
- *recognise my mental health needs as a practitioner*
- *learn about one of the third wave models of CBT*

Looking after yourself and preventing burnout

- *describe the warning signs of potential burn out*
- *explain the causes of burn out*
- *describe strategies that can be implemented to prevent and manage burn out in themselves and colleagues*

Driving with a disability

- *discuss current legislation in relation to pwMS who wish to drive*
- *understand how pwMS are assessed as being fit to drive*
- *identify how they can support pwMS going through the assessment process*

Self-management support in neurological conditions

- *describe the principles of self-management*
- *discuss how self-management can improve outcomes for pwMS*
- *identify techniques they can implement into their own practice which support pwMS to self-manage*

High risk MS drugs – keeping them safe

- *identify the potentially more serious risks associated with DMDs*
- *describe the strategies used to prevent and avoid complications*
- *describe how these complications may present*

- *discuss the issues related to explaining risk to pwMS*
- *identify ways in which they can more effectively communicate risk*
- *understand latest research on communicating complex issues to pwMS*

Which interventions are effective in reducing fatigue in MS?

- *describe the characteristics of MS fatigue*
- *discuss interventions based on exercise and behaviour change which can help to manage fatigue*
